### Look What We're Learning

Reading: We will be reviewing story elements found in fictional stories such as character, setting, plot, and point of view. On Thursday, we will begin reviewing nonfiction text features such as table of contents, index, and glossary.

Math: We will be working on place value up to the millions. Students will be practicing how to write numbers in standard form (156), word form (one hundred fifty six) and expanded form (100+50+6). Students also continue to complete daily problem solving and multiplication timed tests (rocket math).

Grammar & Writing:Fourth graders will review how to write a complete sentence, the four types of sentences, and capitalization rules.

Vocabulary: Students will be introduced to Greek and Latin roots and how knowing these roots can help you decode unfamiliar words when reading.
