<u>Look What We're Learning</u>

Reading: We continue to review nonfiction text features. Students will review graphics such as captions, photographs, diagrams, charts, sidebars, maps, etc. and how these graphics can help you understand what you are reading.

Math: This week we will be reviewing addition with regrouping. By the end of the week, students will be practicing how to add numbers up to the millions place value. We will also comparing numbers using the symbols for greater than, less than, and equal. (<, >, =), These skills along with a review of place value and word problems will be on Friday's quiz.

Grammar & Writing:Students will be reviewing the four sentence types (exclamatory, imperative, declarative, and interrogative.)

Vocabulary: We will learn various words using the Greek/Latin root "photo" meaning "light", and prefixes im- il- and in- meaning "not".

Homework Begins This Week

On Wednesday, the students will be bringing home their first homework assignment and it is due Thursday morning. We encourage parents to complete the assignment with their child or check over their work and have the students correct their mistakes. The homework assignment is worth 2 points. After grading the assignment, a student will receive 2 points if they get 80% or more of the assignment correct. They earn 1 point if they get 70-79% of the assignment correct and 0 points if less than 70% is correct or the assignment is missing. Homework grades will be entered in the gradebook towards the end of the grading period. Please make sure your child remembers to turn in their homework when it is assigned. Those points quickly add up and can make all the difference at the end of the grading period.
